hands that make light Staff, volunteers, committees, contractors etc. This year we have taken on both you can see and projects are imperative to the structural integrity of our church home. Some of these project speak to the desires of our heart and other speak to the require love and care of such an amazing structure.

Our lovely Rain Garden was completed in September of this year. We had many great minds, lots of grants, and many volunteers help in getting this project completed. Many wonderful hands have assisted Phyllis Weare and Karen Duncan with tending to our gardens. We re-stripped the parking lot and it looks amazing, the back of our home is getting a new coat of paint and detailing that has long been needed. We are working on (in the long view) having the rest of the building done. The grand view will match our amazing Dr. Martin Luther King mural on the south side of the building that was completed in September of 2018. You will see new things around our home pertaining to safety coming the end of 2019 and the beginning of 2020. We have had our carpets cleaned and are maintaining their cleanliness as well as taking preventative measures to keep them in good shape. The pew cushions and carpets have been cleaned as well. The windows have been power-washed and the church address in now on the front gate. The compressor that was non-functioning for 9 months has been replaced and the entire HVAC system is being brought up to speed. The heat on the 3rd floor is back on as well as the AC. We will also be replacing signage that has long been in need of care and updating. We are getting new branding to help identify our volunteer staff and security workers and give an updated an welcoming image to who we are. Mildred's bench was moved back to the courtyard as it has been Grace Chapel for some time. Power washing of the building, painting of the basement, and a deep cleaning of our kitchen are all some of the projects that have been completed this year.

All of theses projects have been at a reduced or zero cost. Using grants, volunteers, and companies that have offered discounts in many cases. Phyllis Weare and Karen Duncan with their gardening efforts and our youth team assisting on special occasions. David Frisinger and the Vision Builders team working tirelessly to paint the offices of Yvette (administration) and Melody (bookkeeping) as well as dozens of other much needed projects. Mel & Leitha Menegat, Glenn and Leah McKarrow, The Ybarra family, and many, many others. Thank you all so much for your tireless efforts and loving contributions. We are truly grateful.

Let's Talk Pronouns

Isn't it so lovely to feel like we are being seen and recognized for who we truly are? So many of us take this for granted if our idea of who we are fits in with long-held social norms. As a Cis woman (a woman who was assigned the gender of female at birth, which also matches the gender I feel inside), I benefit from the privilege of being seen and treated as a woman in society. I can access spaces and enjoy freedoms and safety that some of my friends may not be able to access so easily or safely because our society has not yet fully welcomed them in all spaces.

As Disciples of Jesus, we are called to share love and grace to all people. One way we can do this is to recognize ways we can amend our speech and actions to be more inclusive of various gender identities. Knowing and using people's correct pronouns communicates respect and safety. We can use our language to increase inclusivity in our church and community to help people feel they have a safe place to be. There are many different gender identities. Some people were assigned a gender at birth that does not match the gender they feel. Some people do not feel they match either side of the male/female binary of gender that has been long accepted socially. Still others feel like both genders or that their gender can change from day to day, and there are even more ways of experiencing gender that I am learning all the time.

We can't assume we know someone's gender identity based on how they look. How someone dresses or styles their hair does not necessarily communicate their gender. Being referred to as a gender that doesn't match how you feel can feel invalidating and can erase a part of the person's identity.

The efforts of trans and non-binary people and their allies for more gender inclusive language was rewarded recently when the Merriam-Webster Dictionary officially added the singular gender-neutral pronoun "they" into the 2019 dictionary. Using "they" singularly may feel odd to you at first, but it can be learned and it is now an officially recognized English pronoun, changing the modern English language significantly to be more inclusive. With practice, we can help normalize the usage of this pronoun and others (there are even more!).

First Christian Church of Eugene cares about inclusivity and safety of all our members and visitors. Board members and staff are currently working on creating a way to communicate our correct pronouns on our name tags. Until we are able to complete that, we encourage you to begin offering your pronouns when you share your name or information about yourself. Some ways you could do this would be to add your pronouns to your signature line in your email, on your social media page, on name-tags for events, and in conversations. Don't assume you know someone's pronouns. Instead ask, "What are your pronouns?" When we all do this together, it helps reduce stigma that trans, non-binary, and people of other gender identities feel and it creates a welcome space for all. Start paying more attention to how you speak and see if there are other ways you can change your vocabulary to be less gender-based.

FALL CLASS: ABORTION IS A RED HOT NATIONAL ISSUE ONCE AGAIN

Our denomination has consistently taken a pro-choice stance on a woman's access to abortion. However, Disciples congregations and Disciple members do not necessarily agree with each other on when life begins — or the more difficult question: When does personhood begin? As faith people how do we form our beliefs and make decisions on such crucial issues? People of faith draw our beliefs and make our decisions on the basis of four authorities: Scripture, Tradition, Reason

(includes knowledge emerging from researched science), and Experience (personal and communal). This study will explore abortion through these four authoritative sources. During this 6 week session we will seek a theological perspective on abortion; that is, a perspective shaped by God's intent for life.

Sharon Warner is professor emerita of Educational Ministry and a former Dean at Lexington Theological Seminary in Kentucky. She is also an ordained Disciples of Christ minister, was a former professor at Northwest Christian College, and was an elementary school teacher in Roseburg, Oregon.



Future Story 2.0 Update

These will be presented to the congregation once all the data has been collected, probably not until January. The Vision task force has suggested that as a congregation we look again at our Vision Statement that was written 10 years ago and decide if this still represents us. These meetings will give members an opportunity to review and respond to the vision that emerged out of our discernment process led by Dick Hamm in 2007-08. All members of the church and those interested in our mission are encouraged to participate in one of these meetings.
